Geography- We will be learning about mountains and climates and comparing the UK to a non-European region- South Africa.

The children will be exploring the similarities and differences between the UK and South Africa including climates, landscapes, primary languages and famous landmarks.

JOURNEYS- How do challenging journeys help us to grow as people?

RE- What are the deeper meanings of festivals? We will look at how different followers within a religious tradition differ in the way that they celebrate. We will explore the stories that they are remembering.

PSHE- Celebrating differences, challenging assumptions and understanding bullying (linked to anti-bullying week- w/c 14th November.) Using the book Journey to Jo'burg we will explore issues of racism but also think about the ways in which cultural differences can be celebrated.

Guided Reading- We will be focusing on the book '*Kensuke's Kingdom*' by Michael Morpurgo about a boy who makes a journey by boat and lands on a tropical island. Each day we will practise the skills associated with the eight different content domains: vocabulary, retrieval, sequencing/summarising, inference, prediction, link-making, language and effect, similarities and differences.

We will also look at Journey to Jo'burg and a beautiful picture book called Wisp which tells the story of a refugee who finds comfort and solace in a wisp of light.

Writing- We will use these three books to inspire our writing which will focus on stories set in other cultures, recounts, diary writing, setting and character descriptions and explanations.

Science- We will be looking at 'Living things and their habitats.' We will be finding out about the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird. We will also describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

Art- We will be looking at the South African artist Isabel le Roux and creating our own colourful landscapes using her work as our source of inspiration. We will also be sketching animals found in South Africa.

Hokusai's painting 'The Great Wave' is used as the front cover for '*Kensuke's Kingdom*' and we will use watercolours to create our own 'Great Waves.'

Computing- Sharing my technology and online safety.

Music- Classroom Jazz 1.

PE-We will be using our new PE platform- Real PE. Our lessons will be on Wednesdays and Fridays. Our topic for this term is Dynamic balance to agility: Jumping and Landing.

French- 'As tu un animal?' The children will learn to ask each other about their pets and practise talking about the characteristics of domestic animals.
